We are very glad to have your letter of April 20th, and it gives us pleasure to confirm your reception on the morning of the 19th. We have also referred your letter to our Superintendent of Operation of our various stations, who I am sure will be glad to have your report of reception on April 19th, and the comparison with the reception of April 12th.

We trust you may have the pleasure of listening to many more of our programs, and for your information we might say that during the Summer we will have but one evening program, which will begin at 8:45 Eastern Standard Time, unless it should happen to be something special.

Our short wave transmissions are made by means of our international short wave relay system, which is still experimental work and we cannot definitely assure you that all of our programs will be given in this manner, but we can say that the hour mentioned will probably be the only one at which there will be any chance of hearing our Station during the Summer months.

Dear Mr. Slingsby:

I have just received your letter of July 27, and it leads me to believe I have not written you since Mr. Skinner came back. This hardly seems possible as I intended to write immediately after he called on his return, and if I did not do so, I wish to apologize to you for not having written at once to thank you for the book of South African poems which you sent me in his care. This is indeed a very pleasant reminder of our long distance friendship and I certainly appreciate the thoughtfulness which prompted you to send it to me.

I am very much pleased to know that our short wave has been reaching you so successfully and that you were able to get the Tunney-Heeney fight so well. The fact is that we did not have this broadcast on our regular wavelength but on the short wave only, so that you were successful in hearing what many of our listeners in the states failed to get.

I shall endeavor to send you a message by way of the air Saturday night which perhaps you will get several weeks ahead of this acknowledgment to your letter.

Mr. Skinner has not been in the office but once since he came home, as he immediately went to his summer home which is several hundred miles distant from Pittsburgh. I know that Mr. Skinner regrets the fact that he will not visit South Africa next year, as he has made many warm friends there in the past two years. He often speaks of his first visit when you gave him such a thrilling ride to be followed afterwards by your successful reception of Station KDKA.

We are in the midst of a presidential campaign and no doubt you will hear some of the issues discussed between now and the first Tuesday in November which is election day.


