Thank you very much for your reception report of April 22, 1972. It was adressed to our engineering department, but unfortunately our engineers are not prepared to render service to all listeners sending in reports and requiering QSL cards. The fact is that this station never had its own QSL card, - which makes the answering proses a little more painful. This is why your letter has not been taken care of, and we hope you will excuse us.

Tromsø shortwave station is the only one in this country broadcasting the whole whome service programme between 05.00 and 11.00 PM GMT, and we are glad to confirm that you heard the Tromsø transmitter on April 22, this year, between 05.00 and 05.15 hours, Greenwich Mean Time.

We would like to draw your attention to the fact that Radio Norway has a special overseas service with programmes in English on Sundays and Mondays. The transmission schedule enclosed will show you the different frequencies in use.

In answer to your questions regarding the stations at Bjørnøya and Jan Mayen island, we can ascertain that they are operating - but only by the weather services.
