

SHORT WAVE NEWS

What many people call "skill" in tuning for short were stations is nothing more or less than knowing WHEN and WHERE to tune for stations. Nearly all short wave stations are experimental and change their wave lengths or schedules almost without notice. To know when these changes take place is as important to successful reception as having a good receiver.

The time is given in Eastern Standard. Add five hours for Greenwich

FREQUENCY CHANGES

COCQ, Havana, Cuba, moved from 9.71 mc to about 8.56 mc. (Edwards, Pa.) To 8.83 mc. (Nelson, Ill.) Till 1:45 A. M. instead of just 1:00 A.M. and on 8.83 (Davison, Calif.) On 8.71 (Casals, Dom. Rep. On 8.80 (Stark, Mo.) On 8.81 and has harmonic on 17.62, (Stockbridge, Mass.) HC2CW, Guayaquil, Ecuador, moved from 9.32 mc. to 9.13 mc. (Hodge, Calif.) On 9.16 mc. uses slogan "Ondas del Pacífico" and gave address as P. O. Box 1166 and they had improved transmitter, (Davison, Calif.)

NEW STATIONS

The General Electric Company will open a new transmitter located on Treasure Island, site of the San Francisco World's Fair, about the middle of February. This new powerful 20 kw. station will be on 9.53 mc. (31.48 meters) and 15.33 mc. (19.56 meters) the same as W2XAF and W2XAD of Schenectady. Programs will be beamed toward Australia and the Far East and in conjunction with W2XAD and W2XAF, programs will be sent almost twenty-four hours a day.

A new station at Bagdad, Irac, is on the air four times a week. Wavelength and schedule not known, but power is 500 watts (Janson, Germany). Flash!—It is on 4 and 7 mc. between 8:30 A. M. and 3:00 P. M.

A station operated by the National Commercial Broadcasting Service, Private Bag, G. P. O., Wellington, New Zealand, is on 3.48 mc. and 6.96 mc. mc. with 200 watts power. They broadcast alternate fortnights on each frequency, 3.48 mc. one and 6.96 the other, from about 11:00 P.M. Saturdays until 7:00 A.M. Sundays, (Kindell, New Zealand).

"Radio Leo" at Leopoldsville, Belgian Congo, is a new 25 watt station operating Sundays and Holidays on 6.14 mc. between 5:40 and 7:00 A.M. and also irregularly at 10:30 A.M. (Janson, Germany).

"Radio Guadelope" at Point-a-Pitre, Guadelope, French West Indies, is on 7.05 mc. between 6:00 and 7:00 P.M. almost daily, (Legge, N. Y.)

A station RFN, Khabavarovsk, U. S. S. R., is on 6.83 mc. between 2:30 and 7:00 A.M. sometimes relaying the programs of RV15, sometimes not, (Hodge, Calif.)

Another station in Russia using the call RFCQ, is on 9.37 mc. between

6:30 and 5:40 P.M. Signed off with "Internationale," so commonly used by Russian stations. (Nichols, Pa.)

Member Huxley of Missisippi, says that HP5G, Panama City, announced a new and powerful station using the call HOA would go on 26.10 meters or 10.68 mc. We learn that HOA is a long wave station on 2.34 mc.

A station CB1174 owned by Orlandini y Loggio Lfda, Casilla 3455, Santiago, Chile, is heard regularly on 11.74 mc. Has 4 kw. power, (Kindell,

New Zealand).

A station CB1185, owned by Jorge Echegoyen, Santiago, Chile, is on 11.85 mc, with 2,500 watts power. (Kindell, New Zealand).

A station CB1510 at Valparaiso, Chile, will be on 15.10 mc. with 1000 watts power very soon now. (Nelson, Ill.)

OCEANIA

Papua. A station on 7.31 mc. is broadcasting daily 3:00 to 5:00 A.M. now. They relay station 4PM, Port Moresby, Papua, (Kindell, N. Z.) Some say the call is VIG.—Editor. Another one, VHPM, same city is on 8.08 mc., between 4:00 and 6:30 A.M., irregularly.

New Guinea. A station VHSU, at Salmaca, heard one morning on 6.54 mc. and 8.08 mc. between 5:30 and 8:00 A.M. PK6XX at Hollandia, is not a broadcaster but may be heard on 14.00 mc. between midnight and 8:00 A.M. talking to amateurs.

New Caledonia. FK8AA, "Radio Noumea," at New Caledonia, is on 6.12 mc. now Wednesdays, Thursdays, Fridays and Saturdays 2:30 to 3:30 A.M. This one is operated by Charles Graveau, 44 rue del Alma.

Pitcairn. VR6AY is an experimental station on 14.36 mc. heard between midnight and 8:00 A.M. with the best time between 4:00 and 6:00 A.M.

AFRICA

Natal. ZRD, Durban, was heard on 9.72 mc. between 10:00 and 11:45 A.M. several times, (Honda, Calif.) Schedule is supposed to be 7:00 to 9:00 A.M. and noon to 4:00 P.M. on this new frequency.—Editor.

Tripoli. A station heard on 10.24 mc. between 7:00 and 8:30 A.M. was verified as ICK, Tripoli. (Solito, Pa.) What about the address, etc.? / C

Portuguese Africa. CR6AA, Lobito, Angola, Occidental Portuguese Africa, was heard on about 13.00 mc. one Wednesday between 2:45 and 4:30 P.M. (Rubio, Cuba). This is a new frequency. They have also used 9.66 mc. and 7.177 mc.—Editor.

French Somaliland. A station heard every first Thursday of the month 8:00 to 8:30 A.M. (Novotny, Czech). Sorry, but he did not mention frequency used.—Editor.

Spanish Morocco. EA9AI, Melilla, on 7.18 mc. heard Saturdays 9:00 to 10:00 P.M. EA9BJ, Alcazarquivir, on 7.12 mc. also heard at 6:30 P.M., broadcasting, (Legge, N. Y.) EA9AH on 14.03 mc. at Tetuan, is heard as early as 4:00 P.M. and as late as midnight with English being used, 9:00 to 10:00 P.M. Relay "Radio Nacional" programs often.

Union of South Africa. Anyone wanting to get a veri. from Africa should dial to 9.61 mc. between 11:30 P.M. and 12:30 A.M. weekdays for

ZRK, Johannesburg. They broadcast setting-up exercises. Send reports to Box 4559. Johannesburg.

ASIA

Siam. For a time a station was heard on 6.11 mc. broadcasting. It was at Bangkok and was heard between 8:00 and 10:00 A.M. on Wednesdays and Thursdays, (Gallagher, Calif.) Also for a time there was one on 15.23 mc. Mondays, 8:00 to 10:00 A.M. (McDermott, N. Y.) They seem to have moved back to 9.50 mc. and 19.02 mc.

French Indo-China. Radio Hanoi, operated by Radio Club Hanoi, is on 9.51 mc. and 11.90 mc. midnight to 2:00 A.M. and 6:00 A.M. to 10:00 A.M. Gave address as 20 Rue de la Pepiniere, Hanoi, (Kindell, N. Z.) Radio Boy-Landry is heard on about 9.73 and 11.71 mc. FZR-3, Saigon, telephones Paris 8:00 to 9:00 A.M. with five-tone stand-by signal on 16.20 mc. now, (Solito, Pa.)

India. Stations VUD2, Delhi, on 9.59 mc. and VUD3, Delhi, on 15.16 mc. both seem to be broadcasting now from 9:30 P.M. till 11:30 P.M. and can be heard in America well at times. This is a change in schedule, mind you, as it was just one hour earlier a few weeks back. They give news in English at 10:30 P.M. and that is a good time to identify them, (Hofmaster, Ohio; Wooten, Ala.; Stockbridge, Mass.; Stuart, Pa.; Johnson, N.Y.) Member Hodge of California, says VUC2 on 4.88 mc. is good 8:00 till 9:00 A.M. Member Walter of Ohio, reports VUD2 on 9.59 mc. until 8:30 A.M. then fades out. Member Solito of Penna., reports VUD2 on 4.88 mc., VUB2 on 4.90 mc. and VUD2 on 4.99 mc. between 7:00 and 8:00 A.M. coming in well enough to identify. For other schedules see the station list.

Japan. We have printed programs from Japan that show their broadcast schedule as follows: For Europe, 2:30 to 4:00 P.M., JZJ on 11.80 mc. and JZI on 9.53 mc. For South America 4:30 to 5:30 P.M. same stations. For North America, 8:00 to 8:30 P.M. JZJ on 11:80 mc. (JZK is being heard instead on 15.16 mc.) For North America, 7:00 to 7:30 A.M., JZJ on 11.80 mc. For Asia, 8:00 to 9:30 A.M., JZJ on 11.80 and JVP on 7.51. For Hawaii, 12:30 to 1:30 A.M., JZJ on 11.80 Mc. This is their January schedule. Here are some reports from members: JZK on 15.16 mc., not JZJ. heard 8:00 to 8:30 P.M. (Johnson, Herzog, Stuart). JZK at midnight and JVN on 10.60 mc. heard at 4:30 P.M. (Stuart, Pa.) JZJ heard testing till 1:00 P.M. in the afternoon, (Herzog, N.Y.) JVN on 10.66 mc. heard daily 9:00 to 10:00 A.M.; a Japanese also on 6.84 mc., 9:00 to 10:00 A.M. and a phone station JDG heard on 7.61 mc. 8:00 to 9:00 A.M. (Hodge, Calif.) A Japanese broadcaster heard on 6.98 mc. at 6:00 P.M. (Herzog, N. Y.) Letter says they have a JZH on 6.095 mc. and a JZM on 21.52 mc. in addition to stations listed, (Gullberg, Sweden).

China. A broadcast station was first heard on 6.98 mc. using the call XGXA daily 9:00 to 10:00 A.M. (Gallagher, Calif.) Was on 6.90 mc. then moved to 7.01 mc., using the call XGXG and announced schedule as 1:00 A.M. to 9:10 A.M. daily (Honda, Calif.) Is XGSA on 7.00 mc. and located at Kweyiang, Kweichow Province and heard daily 8:00 to 10:00 A.M. instead of just 9:00 A.M. (Hodge, Calif.) Station XTJ on 11.69 mc. is still on the air 7:00 to 7:30 A.M. with programs and till 10:00 A.M. tele-

phoning. Reported with program 8:00 to 8:45 A.M. by Janson of Germany. Burma. The telephone station listed as VVS on 12.87 mc. verified under the call XYN. Address was Engineer in Charge, Mingaladon Radio, Mingaladon, Rangoon, Burma, (Solito, Pa.) Radio Burma at Rangoon, a broadcaster on about 6.007 mc. said they broadcast 9:00 to 9:30 A.M. and 8:45 to 10:45 P.M. in letters to us. Now it is said to broadcast weekdays 7:15 to 10:00 A.M. and 10:00 to 11:00 P.M. and Sundays 10:00 to 11:30 P.M.

Philippines. KZIB, Manila, was heard broadcasting on 9.50 mc. Was heard best Sundays around 4:00 A.M. when VK3ME was off the air, (Kindell, N. Z.) Some Manila station, maybe KZRM, heard on 9.50 mc. (Greenland, England). KZRM is supposed to be on 9.57 mc., you know. Telephone stations KBL, Manila, 11.53 mc. and KTR, Manila, on 10.91 mc. are two new phones heard around 8:00 to 11:00 A.M. (Gallagher and Hodge).

USSR. A station at Khabarovsk, Siberia, is on 6.05 mc. now between 1:00 A.M. and 10:00 A.M. evidently replacing RV15 on 4.25 mc. (Walcott, Honda, Kindell, Slough and Hodge). RFN, same city, is heard on 6.83 mc. at same time, sometimes with same program, (Hodge).

EUROPE

Turkey. Ankara, Turkey, is being heard on 9.46 mc. and 15.19 mc. It is on 9.46 mc. between 11:30 A.M. and 4:00 P.M. daily, sometimes staying on the air till 5:00 and even 6:00 P.M., although usually signing off around 4:00 to 4:15 P.M. (Gullberg, Sweden; Novotny Czech.; Kindell, Stuart, Pa.; Barbancone, N. Y.; Kovisto, Minn.; Dement, Pa., and Casals, Dom. Rep.) Heard on 15.19 mc. at 6:00 A.M. (Kindell, N. Z.) Heard on 15.19 at 3:50 to 4:15 P.M. (Solito, Pa.) Heard on 15.15 mc., not 15.19 from 5:00 to 7:30 A.M. (Janson, Germany). Address (not verified) reported as Turk Muhendisler Birligi, 5 No Lu Oda, Yeni-Sehi, Ankara, Turkey.

Vatican. A letter from the station says HVJ is now able to use seven frequencies. They are: 6.03 mc (49.75 meters), 6.19 (48.47), 9.55 (31.41), 9.66 (31.02), 11.74 (25.55), 15.12 (19.84) and 17.84 (16.82 meters). Their present schedule, which is different from anything we see listed anywhere, is as follows: On 6.03 mc. daily at 2:00 and 2:30 P.M. (till 2:45 P.M.), also Wednesdays and Fridays at 3:00 P.M. on 6.03 mc., on 15.12 mc. Sundays at 1:00 to 1:15 P.M. on 9.55 mc. or 9.66 mc. Sundays at 5:00 A.M. and on either 11.74 mc., 9.55 mc. or 9.66 mc. Wednesdays at 2:30 P.M. Now HVJ has been heard Sundays between 1:00 and 1:30 P.M. on 15.12 mc. and 1:30 and 2:30 P.M. on 11.74 mc. Some say it was a test for a special Christmas program, but this schedule says they use 15.12 mc. every Sunday at 1:00 P.M. (Wooten, Ala.; Walter, Ohio; Stockbridge, Mass.) This new schedule is sent to us by member Stockbridge. Member Novotny of Czechoslovakia reports HVJ on 6.189 mc. at 2:45 P.M. once.

Poland. SPD, Warsaw, on 11.52 mc. heard broadcasting 2:00 to 3:00 P.M. when schedule shows 6:00 to 9:00 P.M. only, (Anthony, D. C.)

Switzerland. Seems like this country is sending out one schedule and keeping another. They give HBL on 9.34 mc. Sundays 7:00 to 7:45 P.M. and 8:00 to 8:45 P.M.; HBQ on 6.675 mc. Sundays, 1:45 to 2:45 P.M.; HBQ

on 11.40 mc. Sundays 1:45 to 2:30 P.M. and Mondays 2:30 P.M. to 3:45 P.M.; HBP on 14.535 mc. Sundays 10:45 to 11:30 A.M. and Mondays 4:00 to 4:15 A.M. Member Gullberg, of Sweden, reports HBH on 18.48 mc. still being used Sundays at 11:00 A.M. One member whose name slipped us asys HBL was heard on Monday at 8:45 P.M., saying it was a regular weekly program, (the station says Sunday). Members Anthony and Janson say HBO was heard 7:00 to 8:00 P.M. And member Novotny says HBJ was heard one Friday at 2:00 P.M. The Director General des Postes et Telegraphos sent out word four months ago that they were opening a station on 9.53 mc. to be heard between 6:45 and 9:00 P.M. The station was picked up on 11.865 mc. and 15.36 mc. but now it is not being heard on any frequency. What happened?

Germany. Anyone interested in listening to the German stations may secure a free copy of their daily programs by sending some good reports to them asking for this schedule. Members Lucke, Illinois; Oxrieder of Canal Zone, and Gallagher of Califronia, report a station on 6.08 mc. between 7:00 and 11:00 P.M. Member Lucke says it is DJZ, Oxrieder says DJM, and Gallagher says DJY. He also says it is at Vienna, not Berlin, and another one is also heard on 9.64 mc. around 10:30 P.M. Remember that stations DJP on 11.85 mc. and DZC on 10.29 mc. broadcast from 7:00 to 8:15 P.M. on the fourtheenth and last days of each month, relaying YUA Yuogoslavia (6.10).

Czechoslovakia. Since the crisis, this country has failed to send us a bulletin showing their schedule and frequencies. Our latest one is shown in our station list. Member Herzog says OLR4A was heard between 4:00 and 5:00 P.M. one Wednesday when not scheduled. Member Woodward reports OLR2A on 6.01 mc. at 3:00 P.M. one Friday, when not scheduled. And member Gallagher reports a station OLR4D on 11.90 mc. one Thursday at 1:00 P.M. This station is new to us all, having never been mentioned on any programs sent to us by the station owners.

Finland. A veri. says they have OFE on 11.78 mc. between 1:05 A.M. and noon and OFD on 9.50 mc. from 12:05 to 5:00 P.M. And also stations OH on 21.55 mc., OHH on 17.80 mc., and OHE on 15.19 mc. (Nelson, III.) Another says OFE is used 1:05 to 1:45 A.M., 5:00 to 6:00 A.M. and 8:00 A.M. to 3:00 P.M. week-days and 1:05 A.M. through to 3:00 P.M. Sundays, (Kovisto, Minn.)

Denmark. A veri. says OZF on 9.52 mc. broadcasts 8:00 to 9:30 P.M. for South America and 9:30 P.M. to 11:00 P.M. for North America, (Stockbridge, Mass.) OZH on 15.16 mc. broadcasts Sundays and Holidays 8:00 A.M. to 1:30 P.M. (Gallagher, Graulich and Solito).

Norway. Oslo was heard on 11.72 mc., a new frequency, between 11:00 A.M. and 4:56 P.M. several Saturdays and Sundays although they signed off at 3:00 P.M. once, (Slough, B. C.)

Holiand. A change in schedule takes place about every week now. The second week in January shows this schedule. PCJ on 9.59 mc. Sundays 1:20 to 1:35 P.M., 2:00 to 3:00 P.M. and 7:15 to 9:25 P.M., Tuesdays 1:45 to 3:30 P.M. and 7:15 to 10:30 P.M., Wednesdays 7:15 to 9:40 P.M. and Fridays 8:00 to 9:00 P.M. PHI on 11.74 mc. is used Saturdays 7:15 to 7:45 P.M. and all other days 6:15 to 6:45 P.M. PCJ2 on 15.22 mc. is

used Tuesdays 3:00 to 4:30 A.M. and Wednesdays 9:30 to 11:30 A.M. PHI2 on 17.78 mc. is used Sundays 6:15 to 9:40 A.M., Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Fridays and Saturdays 7:40 to 8:40 A.M., Mondays and Thursdays 7:40 to 9:00 A.M. Could anything be cut up more? Member Gullberg, of Sweden, says a station PHI1 is heard on 21.51 mc, daily 7:00 to 9:00 A.M. and Sundays 7:00 to 11:00 A.M. or noon. This is a new station to us.

France. Our list shows the stations exactly as the latest schedule sent to us from France shows. Member Janson, of Germany, claims TPB7 on 11.88 mc. broadcasts 8:30 to 11:00 P.M. not 9:30 to midnight, but the

program sheet for January says 9:30 to midnight.

Sweden. SBO on 6.06 mc. or SBP on 11.71 mc, either one, may broadcast Wednesdays and Saturdays 8:00 to 9:00 P.M. for American listeners. Member Janson also reports a change in schedule. SBP is used week-days 1:30 to 2:00 A.M., 5:00 to 7:00 A.M. and 11:00 A.M. to 1:30 P.M., Sundays 3:00 A.M. through to 4:00 P.M. SBO on 6.06 mc. picks up where SBP leaves off and broadcasts till 5:00 P.M.

Italy. Some Italian station is on 9.67 mc., same frequency as W3XAL at nights now, (Shaffar, Iowa). 2RO4 on 11.81 mc. heard broadcasting one Thursday 7:30 to 7:45 P.M. when 2RO3 on 9.64 is scheduled. (Woodword, Mass.) 2RO3 on 9.64 mc, heard testing 11:30 P.M. to midnight off schedule, (Nichols, Pa.) 2RO5 on 15.30 mc. heard 9:30 to 11:00 P.M. sending programs to Ethiopia, (Honda, Calif.) Heard 1:15 to 1:30 P.M. (Nichols, Pa. (Heard 2:00 P.M. (Shaffar, Iowa). At 2:45 P.M. (Slough, B. C.) At 4:00 and 6:00 P.M. (Wooten and Graulich). 2RO6 on 17.82 mc. heard 10:00 A.M. to 1:00 P.M. often, (Gullberg, Sweden). Heard at 1:50 P.M. (Honda and Slough). Strange to say the official program booklets from Italy never mention 2RO5 or 2RO6, but do mention the daily programs of ICC on 6.35 mc., IRF on 9.83 mc., IQY on 11.67 mc., 2RO3 on 9.64 mc. and 2RO4 on 11.81 mc. These are shown in our station list. Member Herzog reports the phone IQA on 14.73 mc. one Sunday. IRF heard daily 2:15 to 2:55 P.M. (Janson, Germany). Two new Italian phones heard on 14.86 mc. and 14.57 mc. around 7:00 to 8:30 A.M. (Solito, Pennsylvania).

Russia. The station heard on 6.03 mc. is at Moscow, using the call RV69 and is not RV15, Khabarovsk, as it is now heard on 4.27 mc. again. Another Russian is also heard now on 3.80 mc. between 1:30 and 4:00 A.M. (Walcott, Calif.) RV69, Moscow 15.18 mc. and another station on 15.27 mc. heard afternoon and evening now, (Novotny, Czech.) This station on 15.18 mc. heard almost all day and night by many now. A new station at Moscow on 13.235 mc. is heard 7:00 to 9:00 A.M. broadcasting, (Gullberg, Sweden). Another one is reported on 7.35 mc. around 4:00 A.M. Phones RCH, Kerbi, on 15.01 mc.; RIR, Tiflis, on 10.08 mc., and RKK, Moscow, on 12.27 mc. heard at 1:30 A.M. working each other. Another one heard on 11.76 mc. at 10:00 A.M. (Gallagher, Calif.)

Spain. Numerous and conflicting reports on the various stations in Franco Spain have been received. Most of these appear in our station list. New reports show these things. Member Gill, of Manila, reports a veri. showing Radio Malaga on 7.22 mc. and 14.44 mc.; Radio Raquette de Vitoria on 11.97 mc.; Las Palmas, Canary Islands, on 14.06 mc. all re-

This is just greatly different from the other five lists we have seen. SHORT WAVE NEWS

What many people call "skill" in tuning for short wave stations is nothing more or less than knowing WHEN and WHERE to tune for stations. Nearly all short wave stations are experimental and change their wave lengths or schedules almost without notice. To know when these changes take place is as important to successful reception as having a good receiver.

The time is given in Eastern Standard. Add five hours for Greenwich

Mean Time.

NEW STATIONS

The long awaited Irish station, "Radio Eireann," located in Moydrum County, near Athlone, will operate on the same frequencies as HVJ but will give HVJ an open frequency for all their broadcasts. These are 6.19 mc. (48.47), 955 mc. (31.41), 11.74 (25.55), 15.12 (19.84) and 17.84 (16.82). They will start testing in February, (Darby, Ireland).

A new 50 kw. transmitter is going up at Baneasa (near Bucharest).

Roumania. (From English newspaper).

The new station at Bagdad, Iraq, (Persia to some) is on the air. It relays YI1J on 7.20 mc. between 8:30 A.M. and 3:00 P.M. and has 500 watts power. QRA: not known, but address of YI1J is I. Hassan, Wireless Stations, Civil Airport, Bagdad, Iraq, (Janson, Germany).

The General Electric Company will open a new transmitter located on Treasure Island, site of the San Francisco World's Fair, about the middle of February. This new powerful 20 kw. station will be on 9.53 mc. (31.48 meters) and 15.33 mc. (19.56 meters) and same as W2XAF and W2XAD of Schenectady. Programs will be beamed toward Australia and the Far East and in conjunction with W2XAD and W2XAF, programs will be sent almost twenty-four hours a day.

A station operated by the National Commercial Broadcasting Service, Private Bag, G. P. O., Wellington, New Zealand, is on 3.48 mc. and 6.96 mc. with 200 watts power. They broadcast alternate fortnights on each frequency, 3.48 mc. one and 6.96 the other, from about 11:00 P.M. Saturdays

until 7:00 A.M. Sundays, (Kindell, New Zealand).

"Radio Leo," at Leopoldsville, Belgian Congo, is a new 25 watt station operating Sundays and Holidays on 6.14 mc. between 5:40 and 7:00 A.M.

and also irregularly at 10:30 A.M. (Janson, Germany).

FG8AA, "Radio Guadelope," at Point-au-Pitre, Guadelope, French West Indies, moved up to about 7.44 mc. and is broadcasting now between 6:00 P.M. and 7:30 P.M., sometimes signing off as early as 7:00 P.M. They give their address as P. O. Box 125 but do not promise veries. Maybe they will verify, we do not know, (Legge, N. Y., Hutchinson, N. H., Lundberg, Minn., Aikins, Ind., Stark, Mo., Olthoff, Kan. and Oxrieder, C. Z.)

A station CB1174 is owned by Orlandini y Loggio Lida, Casilla 3455, Santiago, Chile, and is on 11.74 mc. with 4000 watts power, (Kindell, New Zealand). Heard when COCX is off the air, (Gallagher, Calif.) With 4000 watts this one should be heard everywhere at almost any time.—Editor.

A station CB1185, owned by Jorge Echegoyen, Santiago, Chile, is on 11.85 mc. with 2500 watts power, (Kindell, N. Z.) When CB57 went on the air last spring, this CB1185 was reported, but it turned out to be CB57, now on 12.00 mc. SHORT WAVE NEWS

What many people call "skill" in tuning for short wave stations is nothing more or less than knowing WHEN and WHERE to tune for stations. Nearly all short wave stations are experimental and change their wave lengths or schedules almost without notice. To know when these changes take place is as important to successful reception as having a good receiver.

The time is given in Eastern Standard. Add five hours for Greenwich Mean Time.

NEW STATIONS

The new General Electric station on Treasure Island, site of the San Francisco World Fair, started operating on February 18th when a test program was sent. Using the call-sign W6XBE, this transmitter will operate on 9.53 and 15.33 mc., sharing these frequencies with W2XAF and W2XAD, Schenectady. No schedule has yet been set, but rumor has it that the station will be on 15.33 mc. between 3:00 and 9:00 A. M. Programs will be beamed toward Australia, India and the Far East. Member Callan claims they will operate 7:00 to 10:00 A.M. and 6:00 to 10:00 P.M., but does not give the source of his information. Mr. Darlington of W2XAD and W2XAF, telegraphed news of the first test.

The long awaited Irish station, "Radio Eireann," located in Moydrum County, near Athlone, will operate on the same frequencies as HVJ but will give HVJ an open frequency for all their broadcasts. These are 6.19 mc. (48.47), 955 mc. (31.41), 11.74 (25.55), 15.12 (19.84) and 17.84 (16.82). They will start testing soon, (Darby, Ireland).

A new 50 kw. transmitter is going up at Baneasa (near Bucharest) Roumania. (From English newspaper).

Iraq. A station Y15KG, Bagdad, Iraq, Asia Minor, is a 1,000 watt transmitter operating daily on 7.20 mc., from 7:30 A.M. to 3:00 P.M. 

Does anyone actually hear OIE and OIH? OIE heard at 2:15 P.M. once, but not sure, (Seymour, Md.)

Sweden. A printed schedule from Sweden shows SM5SX on 15.155 mc. week-days 11:00 A.M. to 5:00 P.M. and Sundays 9:00 A.M. to 5:00 P.M. SBP on 11.705 mc. week-days 1:00 P.M. to 4:15 P.M. and Sundays 3:00 A. M. to 4:15 P.M. and every Wednesday, Thursday and Saturday 8:00 to 9:00 P.M. and SBO on 6.06 mc. every day 4:15 to 5:00 P.M. (Sawzelius, Sweden). SBP broadcasts every night now 8:00 to 9:00 P.M. (Galagher, Calif.) Heard till 4:40 P.M. (Stark, Mo.) SBP on 11.70 heard till 4:30 P.M., then went to 6.06 mc. (Eder, Minn, and Stark, Mo.)

SHORT WAVE NEWS

What many people call "skill" in tuning for short wave stations is nothing more or less than knowing WHEN and WHERE to tune for stations. Nearly all short wave stations are experimental and change their wave lengths or schedules almost without notice. To know when these changes take place is as important to successful reception as having a good receiver.

The time is given in Eastern Standard. Add five hours for Greenwich Mean Time.

NEW STATIONS

Bahamas. A letter says ZNS, Nassau, has 200 watts power, operates on 6.09 mc. or 49.2 meters and broadcasts 1:30 to 2:00 P. M. and 8:00 to 9:00 P.M. Identification signals are as follows: Opening signal-Saint Margarets Chimes, London; sign-off "God Save the King." Relay of Westminster Chimes and Big Ben at 8:00 and 9:00 P. M. QRA: K. P. Brown, Secretary of Broadcasting, P. O. Box 48, Nassau, Bahamas, (Lundberg, Minn.) Heard 7:35 P.M. (Oskay, N.J.) Heard 9:30 P.M. (Legge, N.Y.) Heard at 9:40 P.M. (Adler, N.Y.) Heard at 8:15 P.M. Officials have rented German short wave stations to relay programs to overseas listeners twice monthly, but have decided to build their own transmitter.

SHORT WAVE NEWS

What many people call "skill" in tuning for short wave stations is nothing more or less than knowing WHEN and WHERE to tune for stations. Nearly all short wave stations are experimental and change their wave lengths or schedules almost without notice. To know when these changes take place is as important to successful reception as having a good receiver.

The time is given in Eastern Standard. Add five hours for Greenwich Mean Time.

NEW STATIONS

Kuanas, Lithuania. Station LY1J tested daily from July 9th to 19th, from 10:00 to 11:00 P. M. on 14.00 and 14.076 mc. and in a letter to us stated that Lithuania has a station LYR on 9.29 mc (32.20 meters) daily, midnight to 1:00 A.M. and noon to 2:00 P. M. The address of LY1J is Petras Vanagaitis, Hipodrome 14b, Kuanas.

Jarvis Islands. A newspaper report gives reception of K6NVJ on 10.56 mc. or 28.40 meters at 3:20 A.M., E.S.T. Located in mid-Pacific (Mallory, Africa).

Nearly all short wave stations are experimental and change their wave lengths or schedules almost without notice. To know when these changes take place is as important to successful reception as having a good receiver.

The time is given in Eastern Standard. Add five hours for Greenwich

Mean Time.

Colombia. Some station on 9.71 mc. heard announcing "The New Station, Bogota," heard evenings, (Bird, Del.) (Note: A harmonic of HJCF, Bogota, formerly HJ3CAF, falls on 9.71 mc. It is on 4.855 mc.) Many are hearing this station on 9.71 and we want to know if it is really a harmonic or not.

Newfoundland. VONG, St. John's, heard on new frequencies of 9.45 mc. at 5:30 P.M. Saturday afternoons, (Edwards, Pa.) Heard relaying London on 5.98, 8:00 to 8:33 P.M. (Waite, N.Y.) Is on 5.69, not 5.98, 8:30 to noon and 1:30 to 8:30 P.M. (Callan, Mass.) Heard on 5.98, (Greenland, England). On 5.71, (Iball, England). On 9.64, (Seaman, N. H.)

SHORT WAVE NEWS

What many people call "skill" in tuning for short wave stations is nothing more or less than knowing WHEN and WHERE to tune for stations. Nearly all short wave stations are experimental and change their wave lengths or schedules almost without notice. To know when these changes take place is as important to successful reception as having a good receiver.

The time is given in Eastern Standard. Add five hours for Greenwich Mean Time.

Stations Under Construction

Cuba. A station COCN, Havana, is supposed to open on 9.437 mc. soon. Greece. Two new transmitters of high power will operate from Sparta as follows: 6.885—SVD; 7.228—SVL; 7.805—SVG; 9.03—SVH; 9.695—SVI; 9.825—SVJ; 9.935—SVM: 10.705—SVN: 12.195—SVP: 13.64—SVQ.

Belgium. A new transmitter at Ruysselede, the home of ORK, will soon operate on 11.85 mc. and will have 45,000 watts power.

Cincinnati, Ohio. The new WLWO, 50,000 watt transmitter is nearing completion and will be heard soon. With beam antennas this new station may operate as follows: $6.06~\rm mc$, $9.59~\rm mc$., $15.27~\rm mc$ and $21.56~\rm mc$.

Wanneroo, Australia. VLW, a new station, will be testing this fall and winter on 6.13 mc., 9.56 mc. and 11.83 mc. Station has 2,000 watts power (Australian radio magazine). New transmitters at Lyndhurst and Perth are under construction. Lyndhurst to go on 7.25 mc. and 7.28 mc. and Perth on 6.13, 9.56 and 11.83 mc. (Indian Radio Times).

New Zealand. We have two different reports on stations under construction at Wellington. From New Zealand came word that around January first a new station will go on the air. Wavelengths are ZL-1 on 9.54 mc., ZL-2 on 11.78 mc., ZL-3 on 15.28 and ZL-4 on 17.77. Member Fister says it is ZL-1 on 6.08 mc., ZL-2 on 9.54 mc., etc.

Senagal. Rumors prevail that shortly a new 10 kw. short wave broadcast station will commence operations at Dakar. It will be under the supervision of the Minister des Postes et Telegraphos.

Iran. Two transmitters of 2,000 and 20,000 watts power are under construction. One is for European reception, the other for world-wide reception. Member Callan believes he heard EQC on 9.68 mc. at 7:15 A.M. one Tuesday Said "La Voz de Teherana."

Tangiers. A new 10,000 watt transmitter is under construction according to word received from an amateur there, (McDermott, N. Y.)

Chile. CB-946, Santiago, a new 5 kw. station to operate on 9.46 mc. is under construction.

Spain. The new government has ordained that a new 40 kw. transmitter, to operate on several frequencies be built.

Venezuela. A transmitter to be operated by the Director of Radio Communications at Caracas will operate on 6.172 mc. (YVKF) 9.64 mc.

(YVSC), 11.725 mc. (YVOR) and 15.315 mc. (YVPX). It will have 30 kw. power, the most powerful station in Venezuela.

India. That newspaper schedule last month must have been wrong. Reports received from members indicate our list is correct. Here are some of them: VUB2, Bombay on 9.55 mc., heard when XEFT, Mexico, is not on the air, from 9:30 to 10:30 P.M., along with VUD2, Delhi, on 9:59 mc. (Legge, N. Y.) VUD2, Delhi, on 9.59 mc. heard 6:55 to 7:45 A. M., English used 7:30 to 7:37 A. M., list shows 7:30 A. M. as starting time, (Waite, N. Y.) VUD4, Delhi, on 15.30 mc. heard up till noon, (Gallagher, Calif.) Listeners should dial on 9.55 mc., 9.59 mc. and 15.16 mc. from 9:30 to 10:30 P. M. and 6:30 to 9:30 A. M.

Siam. HS6PJ, 19.02 mc. and HS8PJ, 9.51 mc., Bangkok, will both soon be used every day 7:00 to 10:00 A. M.

China. XPSA, Kweiwang, on 6.97 mc. is heard 5:30 to 11:10 A. M. and 5:00 to 6:00 P.M., with English used 9:00 to 9:10 A.M. XGOY on 11.90 is used 2:00 to 4:20 P.M. and 4:30 to 6:30 P.M. and 5:30 to 11;30 A.M., with English used 6:15 to 6:25 A.M. IQY on 11.67 is not used 7:30 to 9:00 P.M. 2RO6 on 15.30 is used 3:00 to 5:30 P.M. and 7:30 to 9:00 P.M. 2RO14, on 15.34 is heard nearly every afternoon. 2RO16 on 21.51 mc. is heard regularly 9:00 to 10:00 A.M. 2RO15 on 11.75 mc. is heard at 6:00 A.M. 2RO12 on 15.10 mc. is heard almost all day. Member Woodward says 2RO6 on 15.30 mc. is

heard till 4:45 P.M., not just 4:00 P.M. 2RO3 on 9.63 mc. broadcasts 1:00 to 2:20 A.M. for Australia, (Dement, Pa. and Granlich, N. J.)

Portugal. No one can tell just how these stations will broadcast. CSW7 on 9.74 mc., Lisbon, used 4:00 to 8:00 P.M. (Ewards, Pa.) Heard till 9:20 P. M. once last month, (Woodward, Mass.) Uses English 3:00 to 3:40 P.M., Tuesdays and Fridays, (Lowery, England). CSW8, on 7.26 mc. used Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays, 4:05 to 5:00 P.M. (Iball, Eng.)

Switzerland. The Swiss stations are oftentimes rented to relay programs and since the war have kept a very irregular schedule. We list only the regular scheduled programs.

Denmark. A new series of call-signs have been arranged. They are OXY-2 on 6.045 mc., OXY-3 on 6.17 mc., OZI on 17.81 mc. and OZI-3 on 17.835 mc.

Yugoslavia. Direct from Belgrade comes these details. YUA and YUB are on 6.10 mc. YUC is on 9.505 mc. YUD is also on 9.505 mc. YUE is on 11.775 mc. YUF and YUG are on 15.24 mc. A late report indicates that YUE on 11.775 has replaced YUF-YUG, but we are not sure. On the 14th and last days of the month DJP, Berlin, on 11.855 mc. and DZC on 10.29 mc. joins YUA and YUG from 7:00 to 8:15 P.M. YUA, 6.10 mc. heard at midnight, off schedule, (Graulich, N J.)

Holland. PCJ on 9.56 mc., PCJ-2 on 15.22 mc. and PHI-2 on 17.77 mc. all operate on an irregular schedule, changing about once each week. You may hear any of them not on the schedule we show.

Ireland. A new schedule is in effect. Radio Eirann, Dublin, is on 17.84 mc., 7:30 to 8:30 A.M. and 9:00 to 10:00 A.M., on 9.595 mc. 12:30 to 4:30 P.M. and 5:00 to 6:00 P.M. Power 15,000 watts now, (Lowery, England). Heard at 5:00 P.M. now, (Bird, Del.)

The Vatican. HVJ operates as follows: On 6.19 fc. week-days at 2:00 P.M. Thursdays at 2:30 P.M. and Wednesdays at 3:00 P.M. On 11.74 Tuesdays at 8:30 A.M. On 15.12 mc. Sundays at 1:00 P.M. Tuesdays at 10:30 A.M. and Wednesdays at 2:30 P.M. It does not use 9.55 mc. now. (Callan, Mass.)

Roumania. Sometimes we wonder if there is such a station as YRO, Baneasa, reported on 12.16 mc. between noon and 1:00 P.M. and around 15.40 mc. around 9:00 to 10:15 P.M. A good many members say this is a Russian station. Member Fister says it is RV99 at Irkutak on 15.41 mc. and member Callan heard the announcer at Moscow say RV99 was broadcasting on 15.41 mc.

Russia. Under "New Stations Heard" we show a list of stations and schedules received direct from Moscow. We have corrected our list according to this new list. Member Fister reports he heard the new one on 11.90 mc. at 5:00 P.M. Some station that may be the one supposed to be 11.63 mc. is heard on 11.65 mc. at 6 A.M. by members Stockbridge and Callan. Member Oxrieder says RAN is roaming around between 9.693 and 9.688 mc. instead of 9.60. RNE, Moscow, on 12.00 mc. heard at 12:30 A.M. off schedule, (Bird, Del.)

France. A new Parisian station is on 11.843 mc. 12:30 to 1:30 P.M. and again later in the afternoon when it joins TPB12 on 11.88 mc. And the one on 9.68 mc. is heard at 6:00 P.M., too, (Callan, Mass). TPB12 on 11.88 mc. heard 10:00 to 11:00 A.M. off schedule, (Woodward, Mass.) Spain. Radio Malaga, Malaga, is on 14.44 mc. some evenings around 6:00 to 9:00 P.M. FET-1 is on 7.07 mc. 12:30 to 1:00 P.M. and 3:30 P.M. onwards and Radio Malaga is also on 7.22 mc. after 3:30 P.M. (Lowery, England). A veri says EAQ, Madrid, on 9.86 mc. is used Saturdays 1:00 to 3:00 P.M., Sundays 8:30 to 9:30 P.M. and week-days 5:00 to 7:30 P.M., address still Box 591, (Schubert, Iowa). This may have been printed before the war made changes in the station.

Sweden. Americans should dial on 15.15 mc. and 11.70 mc. Wednesdays and Saturdays from 8:00 to 9:00 P.M. for Sweden. Other stations and schedules are shown in our list.

Germany. Station DJC on 6.02 mc. is now used, along with DXB on 9.61 mc. from 4:50 P.M. to 1:00 A.M. next day. DJD on 11.77 mc. also is in this group, (Markuson, Col.; Graulich, N. J.; Callan, Mass.) Germany has acquired a new frequency of 11.99 mc., heard at 6:00 A.M. and in the afternoons, (Callan, Mass.) Germany heard on 9.624 mc. and 9.70 mc., pew frequencies, (Oxrieder, Canal Zone). Heard on 9.70, (Bird, Del.) DXB on 9.61 mc. heard at 2:55 P.M. off schedule, (Zimpleman, Ind).

England. The B. B. C. send us a weekly bulletin of programs, they announce an entirely different schedule and then we tune and find still another. All we can do is list stations just as they mail them to us. Our list shows the latest data sent us, but here are some reports that differ: GSL is used on 6.11 mc., 6:22 to 9:15 P.M. and also 9:37 to 12:30 A.M. along with GSA on 6.05 mc., GRX on 9.69 mc., all of which are not scheduled in the B.B.C. bulletin, Callan, Mass.) GSE on 11.68 mc. heard 1:00 P.M. to 3:30 P.M., also different, (Woodward, Mass.) Are they trying to confuse the Germans or us? GSA on 6.05 mc. heard till 1:45 A.M. (Graulich, N. J.)

Luxembourg. This new station operates three days on a frequency and then changes schedule one hour later. They use 15.35 mc. and 6.09 mc. We do not have their schedule, but suggest readers dial on 6.09 mc. between 8:00 A.M. and noon and on 15.35 mc. between 6:00 A.M. and 10:00 A.M. for the next month. They are also on 9.52 mc. and 11.776 mc. irregularly.

SOUTH AMERICA

Argentina. LRA5, Buenos Aires, on 17.83 mc. heard from 3:00 to 5:00 P.M. Fridays, (Anthony, D. C.) LRA2, 6.185 mc. is on the air some evenings 5:30 to 9:00 P.M. LRX, Buenos Aires, on 9.66 mc. heard signing off at 10:10 P.M., not 1:00 A.M. (Dement, Pa.) Note—LRX may leave the air at any hour of the day, or remain on.

Chile. CB-1174, Santiago, "Radio Houcke" relays CB-93 from 6:00 to 10:30 P.M. and is reported about once a year. CB-960, Santiago, on 9.60 heard till 10:00 P.M. instead of just 8:30 P.M. (Dement, Pa.)

Bolivia. CP5, La Paz, heard on 6.20 mc. around 7:30 P.M. (Oxrieder, C. Z.) Heard 9:00 to 11:00 P.M. once. (Legge, N. Y.)

Brazil. Some station on 8.19 or 8.20 mc. relays PSH programs 6:00 to 7:00 P.M. (Callan, Mass.) One was heard on 12.08 mc. for a time, (Fister, N.Y.) PSE on 14.94 mc. oftentimes heard around 7:00 to 8:00 P.M. PRA8, Pernambuco, on 6.02 mc. heard signing off at 9:00 P.M., not 8:00 P.M. (Bird. Del.)

Ecuador. HCODA, Guayaquil, verified by registered mail, and said 9.40,

not 9.44 mc. (Stockbridge, Mass.)

Uruguay. CXA2, Montevideo, heard on 9.57 mc., close to WBOS, Boston, 5:30 to 10:30 P.M., having moved from 6.00 mc. (Waite, N. Y. and Oxrieder, C. Z.) CXA6, Montevideo, is a sister station to CX4A once on 6.14 mc. It is on 9.63 mc. (Oxrieder, C. Z.)

Venezuela. YV5RY, "La Voz de la Esfera," is on 4.76 mc., not 4.79, (Oxrieder, C. Z.) YV5RO, Caracas, is on 4.94, not 4.95 mc., and YV4RO, Valencia, is on 4.95, not 4.93 mc. (Gallagher, Calif.) A station called "Radio Caracas," heard on 10.10 around 5:25 P.M. (Dement, Pa.) Note—A harmonic of YV5RN, 5.04 mc. falls on 10.08 mc.
