SHORT WAVE NEWS

What many people call "skill" in tuning for short wave stations is nothing more or less than knowing WHEN and WHERE to tune for stations. Nearly all short wave stations are experimental and change their wave lengths or schedules almost without notice. To know when these changes take place is as important to successful reception as having a good receiver.

The time is given in Eastern Standard. Add five hours for Greenwich

Mean Time.

Stations Under Construction

Little America. Admiral Byrd's Expedition will have three commercial and three amateur calls. Amateur calls will be KC4USA at the West Base, KC4USB at the East Base, and KC4USC on the snow cruiser. Commercial calls will be KTRK West Base, KTRC East Base and KTRA on the snow cruiser, (Graulick, N. J.) The expedition will have sixteen commercial frequencies and will operate on the 20, 40 and 80 meter bands as an amateur station contacting amateur stations the world over. (Editor).

Cuba. A station COCN, Havana, is supposed to open on 9.437 mc. soon.

Greece. Two new transmitters of high power will operate from Sparta as follows: 6.885—SVD; 7.228—SVL; 7.805—SVG; 9.03—SVH; 9.695—SVI; 9.825—SVJ; 9.935—SVM: 10.705—SVN: 12.195—SVP: 13.64—SVQ.

Belgium. A new transmitter at Ruysselede, the home of ORK, will

soon operate on 11.85 mc. and will have 45,000 watts power.

Cincinnati, Ohio. The new WLWO, 50,000 watt transmitter is nearing completion and will be heard soon. With beam antennas this new station may operate as follows: 606 mc, 959 mc, 15.27 mc and 21.56 mc.

New Zealand. We have two different reports on stations under construction at Wellington. From New Zealand came word that around January first a new station will go on the air. Wavelengths are ZL-1 on 9.54 mc., ZL-2 on 11.78 mc., ZL-3 on 15.28 and ZL-4 on 17.77. Member Fister says it is ZL-1 on 6.08 mc., ZL-2 on 9.54 mc., etc.

Senagal. Rumors prevail that shortly a new 10 kw. short wave broadcast station will commence operations at Dakar. It will be under the supervision of the Minister des Postes et Telegraphos.

Iran. Two transmitters of 2,000 and 20,000 watts power are under construction. One is for European reception, the other for world-wide reception. Member Callan believes he heard EQC on 9.68 mc. at 7:15 A.M. one Tuesday Said "La Voz de Teherana."

Chile. CB-946, Santiago, a new 5 kw. station to operate on 9.46 mc. is under construction.

Spain. The new government has ordained that a new 40 kw. transmitter, to operate on several frequencies be built.

Venezuela. A transmitter to be operated by the Director of Radio Communications at Caracas will operate on 6.172 mc. (YVKF) 9.64 mc.

NEW STATIONS HEARD

Australia. At least five new frequencies are reported for new Australian stations. Most important of the lot is VLQ, a powerful new station at Sydney, which is heard on 9.615 mc. testing between 3:30 A. M. and 9:00 A.M. irregularly. It is heard best, according to reports, between 6:00 and 9:00 A.M. It is a government owned station, (Callan, Mass.; Traister, Ill.; Werner, Calif.; Maurice, N. Y.; Legge, N. Y.; Lovelace, N. Y.) Second, a new 2000 watt transmitter at Wanneroo, VLW, has been heard as follows: On 6.13 mc. 5:30 to 7:00 A.M. On 9.56 mc. 7:00 to 8:00 A. M., saying it was operated by the Australian Broadcasting Commission, P. O. Box 1866, G. P. O., Melbourne, (McDermott, N. Y.) On 11.83 mc. 9:30 to 10:30 A.M. (Legge, N. Y.) Third, VLK, Sydney, heard on 9.60 mc. signing off at 7:30 A.M. saying, "V for Victory, L for London, and K for Kangeroo, on 9,600 kilocycles, (McDermott, N. Y.) Note—VLK is the commercial telephone call of the station at Sydney that works England, but it was never reported broadcasting, nor on 9.60 mc. before.—Editor.

Special. Special Here is the Australian station set-up sent to us by Arthur Bear of London. VLQ, Sydney, on 9.615 mc. broadcasts daily 2:00 to A.M., 6:30 to 6:50 A.M., 7:00 to 8:00 A.M., 8:15 to 8:45 A.M., and 10:30 to 11:30 A.M. The 7:00 to 8:00 and 10:30 to 11:30 programs are for America. VLR, Melbourne, on 9.58 mc. broadcasts 9:00 to 9:30 A.M.

VLW-3, Waneroo, on 11.83 mc. broadcasts 12:30 to 1:30 A. M. VLR-3 Melbourne, on 11.88 mc. broadcasts 6:35 to 7:00 P.M. evenings), and VLQ-2, Waneroo, on 11.87 mc. broadcasts 2:30 to 3:30 A. M.

Barbados. The government operates a station on 3.95 mc. which broadcasts daily 6:30 to 7:00 P.M., giving news, (Watkins, Barbados).

Salvador. YSW, San Salvador, is on 6.145 mc., 9:30 to 10:00 P.M., was opened in November, (Graulich, N. J.)

Mexico. XEHX or XDHX, "La Banco Nacional de Mexico," location unknown, heard testing on 11.11 mc. evenings, (Oxrieder, Canal Zone).

Mexico. XEKW, "El Eco de Michoacan." Morelia. Michoacan, owned by Ing. Jose Martinez Ramirez, is on 6.03 mc., 10:00 to 11:00 P.M. broadcasting and verified promptly, (Legge, N. Y.)

Mexico. A station at Mazathlan, heard on 10.40 mc. at 10:00 P.M. asking for reports on new transmitter, (Casals, Dom. Rep.)

Uruguay. CXA-7, Montevideo, is on 11.482 mc. relaying CX-26 evenings (Oxrieder, Canal Zone).

Uruguay. CXA 14, Colonia, is on 11.827 mc. relaying LR-6, Argentina, from 7:00 to 8:00 P.M. (Legge, N. Y.)

Mozambique, Africa. CR7BE, Lourenco Marques, on 9.64 mc. with very powerful signal (best of all African stations), between 12:20 and 4:00 P. M., irregularly and between 2:00 and 4:00 P.M. almost daily. Gives address as Post Office Box 594. Announces 9.61 mc., heard on 9.64, (Maurice, N. Y.; Hutchinson, N. H.; Legge, N. Y.)

Flash. Radio Club of Mazambique, Box 594, Lourenco Marques, announces these stations are being used 2:00 to 4:00 P.M. daily. CR7AB (3.49 mc.), CR7AA (6.13 mc.), CR7BE (9.65 mc.), CR7BD (15.25 mc.) CR7BD and CR7BE are heard 2:00 to 4:00 P.M., but CR7BH on 11.72 mc. is not mentioned nor heard, (Legge, N. Y.)

Nicaragua. YNJAT, Leon, operated by Jose Agustin Tijerino, is on 5.758 mc. between 7:00 and 10:00 or 10:30 P.M. week-days only, (Legge, N. Y.) This is not to be confused with YNDG, Leon, on 7.66 mc.

Bahamas. A station on 8.14 mc. at Nassau heard at 7:30 F.M. saying they were testing new transmitter and mentioning ZIO on 8.14 mc., ZSS-2 near 5 mc., ZSR on 3.00 mc. and ZNS-2 on 6.30 mc. (National Radio Club).

Iran. Some station on 9.68 mc. heard from 7:00 to 7:30 A.M. said at sign-off, "La Voz de Teherana, Ay-Koo-Say." Believed to be EQC at Terheran, Iran (Persia), (Callan, Mass.)

Andorra. "Radio Andorra" in the Republic of Andorra, between France and Spain, heard on 8.57 mc. and at another time on 11.83 mc. at 2:00 P. M. (Boothroyd, Eng.)

Nepal. A station on 14.78 mc. is reported at 4:00 A.M. and near 9:30 P.M. supposed to be at Katmandu, Nepal.

Portugal. Stations CSW-4 on 15.21 mb and CSW-5 on 11.84 mc., both at Lisbon, are heard around 11:00 A.M to 3:00 P.M. (Boothroyd, England).

Iraq. Some station is on 7.87 mc. using Arabic between 1:45 and 4:30 P. M. ((Boothroyd, England).

Algeria. Telephone station TPZ 2, Algiers, on 8.96 mc., broadcasts Tuesdays and sometimes Saturdays from about 12:30 to 1:30 P. M.

French Somaliland. FZE, Djibouti, on 17.28 mc., a telephone station, broadcasts Mondays through Fridays 8:00 to 8:30 A. M. now, (Boothroyd, England).

Ethiopia. I2AA, Addis Ababa, on 9.65 mc. heard daily 1:30 to 2:15 P. M. (Lowery, England). New schedule we see listed is 3:30 to 5:00 A.M. and 11:00 A. M. to 2:30 P. M.

Portuguese Africa. CR6RC, Luanda, Angola, on 11.74 mc. broadcasts daily 6:30 to 7:45 A.M., Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Saturdays, 3:30 to 5:00 P.M., Sundays 9:00 A.M. to 1:00 P.M. Has 50 watts power. Radio Club de Angola, Caixa Postal 229, (National R. C.)

ASIA

Japan. Schedule for January is JVW on 7.257 mc., 2:00 to 4:00 P.M., JZI on 9.53 mc., 7:00 to 9:30 A.M. and 2:00 to 4:00 P.M., JZJ on 11.80 mc. midnight to 1:30 A.M., 7:00 to 9:30 A.M. and 4:30 to 5:30 P.M.; JZK on 15.16 mc., 4:30 to 5:30 P.M. and 8:00 to 9:00 P.M. This last program is for America.

Iraq. Some station on 7.87 mc. using Arabic and believed to be YI5KG, Bahgdad heard 1:45 to 4:30 P. M. (Boothroyd, England).

India. Listeners should dial on 15.16 mc., 9.59 mc. and 9.55 mc. between 9.30 and 10:30 P.M. and 6:30 and 9:30 A.M. for Indian stations, and on 4.96 mc., 4.82 mc. and 4.88 mc. from 7:30 A.M. to 11:00 A.M. for others.

China. XGOX, Szechwan, has been testing recently on 9.65 mc. or 31.09 meters between 1:00 and 3:00 A.M. and 9:00 and 9:30 A.M. (Ong, Arizona; Gallagher, Calif., and Werner, Calif.) Was on 9.50 mc. also just before they went to 9.56, (Gallagher). Is on 15.20 mc. between 8:30 and 10:45 P.M. also, (Ong, Ariz.) Was on 11.90 mc. 9:00 to 9:30 A.M. (Gallagher, Calif.) Uses call XGOY and XGOX. XPSA, Kweiwang, on 6.97 mc. broadcasts 5:30 to 11:10 A.M. and 5:00 to 6:00 P.M., using English 9:00 to 9:10 A.M. XGOY is usually on 11.90 mc. 2:00 to 6:30 P.M. and 5:30 to 11:30 A.M., too. XMHA, Shanghai, operated by the Japanese, is on 11.86 mc. daily now, 5:00 to 11:00 A.M.

Philippines. After reading many reports over the past few months, we have decided that this is the set-up in the Philippines. KZRH, "The Voice of the Philippines," operated by Radio Heacock, Heacock Bldg., Manila, is on 9.636 mc. and 6.10 mc., alternating, between 3:00 and 11:00 A.M., signing off with "The Star Spangled Banner." KZIB, operated by Beck's Department Store, Manila, is on 9.50 mc. and 6.04 mc. between 6:00 and 11:00 P.M. and 5:30 and 11:00 A.M. KZRF, "Radio Philippines." is

on 6.14 mc. between 5:30 P.M. and 11:30 A.M. next day. It is operated by Radio Philippines, Insular Life Bldg., Manila. KZRM, Manila, is on 9.57 mc. and programs from this station are relayed by KZRF, so you hear the call KZRM on several frequencies. Veri from KZ1B gives details on this station, (Robinson, Iowa). Others who helped are members Oliver, Schubert, Legge, Callan, Keast and Werner.

Indo-China. Radio Saigon, Saigon, is heard on 11.78 mc. now, 11:00 P.M. to 12:45 A.M. and 6:00 to 11:00 A.M., signing off with French Natianal anthem. A veri said they were on 6.116 mc. with English programs daily 6:00 to 6:45 A.M. with a "Mail Bag" program Tuesdays. We read that they have discontinued using 6.11 mc., but member Callan says they are on both 6.116 and 11.78.

Dutch Boreno. Telephone station YCP at Balikpapan now uses a new call, YCC, and is on 9.12 mc. around 7:00 A.M. (Legge, N. Y.)

Manchoukuo. MTCY, Hsingking, is operated on 6.13 mc. and 11.775 mc. A verification gives their 11.77 mc. schedule as follows: To Europe, 4:00 to 4:50 P.M. For America, 1:30 to 2:30 A.M. For Asia, 9:50 to 10:55 A.M. No schedule is given for 6.13 mc. Address is Short Wave System, Central Broadcasting Station, Ksingking, Manchoukuo, (Gallagher, Calif.) Heard on 11.77 at midnight, contrary to schedule, (Werner, Calif.) Heard on 6.13 mc. 6:50 to 9:00 A.M. almost daily, (Gallagher, Calif.) Heard on 11.77 mc. after 2:30 A.M. sometimes, (Gallagher). Heard at 12:30 A.M. off schedule, (Schubert, Iowa). Heard at 1:00 A.M. (Werner, Calif.) At 9:50 A.M. (Waite, N. Y.) at 4:00 P.M. (Lowery, Eng.)

EUROPE

Vatican City. HVJ, on 6.19 mc. will broadcast for the U. S. A. in English every Wednesday and Sunday night at 9:30 P. M. now.

Luxembourg. One member reports that Radio Luxembourg closed down at the beginning of the war, but we have received reports of reception since then and we wonder if they are off the air. They use 15.35 mc., 11.776 mc., 9.52 mc. and 6.09 mc.

Sweden. Stations SBU on 9.53 mc. and SBP on 11.71 mc. now broadcast every day 8:00 to 9:00 P.M. instead of SBP and SBT on 15.15 mc. broadcasting Wednesdays and Saturdays only, (Westerberg, Mass.)

Portugal. Two new stations, CSW-4 on 15.21 mc. and CSW-5 on 11.84 mc. heard around 11:00 A.M. to 3:00 P.M. (Boothboyd, England) CSW-6 on 11.04 mc. used 1:00 to 3:30 P.M. and CSW-7 on 9.74 mc. used 4:00 to 8:00 P.M. now (Edwards, Pa.) CSW-8 on 7.26 mc. used Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays 4:05 to 5:00 P.M. (Iball, England).

Yugoslavia. YUA and YUB, both on 6.10 mc. broadcast 12:45 to 2:00 A.M., 6:30 to 7:45 A.M. and 11:20 to 4:45 P.M.; YUE on 11.74 and YUG on 15.24 mc. broadcast 6:55 to 7:55 P.M. and YUD on 9.50 mc. and YUF on 15.24 mc. broadcast 8:00 to 9:00 P.M. This is their latest schedule, (Boothroyd, England).

Finland. Since the Russian invasion, not a peep has been heard out of the Finnish shortwave stations as far as we can learn. The list includes OFD on 9.50 mc., OFE on 11.78 mc., OIH on 17.80 mc. and OII on

21.55 mc. Anyone hearing any of these stations, please notify us at once.

Hungary. HAD, Budapest, up to December 16th, broadcast as follows: 21.63 mc., noon to 3:00 P.M., 11.95 mc. 3:00 to 6:00 P.M., 9.625 mc. 6:00 to 9:00 P.M. and 7:22 mc. 9:00 P.M. to midnight, (Legge, N.Y. and Callan, Mass.) Heard on 21.63 and 7.22, (same reporters).

Italy. Each month the EIAR sends us a program sheet and we guide our list by it. Different from the list, however, are these reports from member Callan. IQY on 11.67 is not used 7:30 to 9:00 P.M. 2RO6 on 15.30 is used 3:00 to 5:30 P.M. and 7:30 to 9:00 P.M. 2RO14, on 15.34 is heard nearly every afternoon. 2RO16 on 21.51 mc. is heard regularly 9:00 to 10:00 A.M. 2RO15 on 11.75 mc. is heard at 6:00 A.M. 2RO12 on 15.10 mc. is heard almost all day. Member Woodward says 2RO6 on 15.30 mc. is heard till 4:45 P.M., not just 4:00 P.M. 2RO3 on 9.63 mc. broadcasts 1:00 to 2:20 A.M. for Australia, (Dement, Pa. and Graulich, N. J.) 2RO-8 on 17.32 mc. heard 7:30 to 9:00 P.M. (Casals, Dom. Rep.) 2RO-15 on 11.76 mc. heard 2:40 to 3:10 P.M. and 4:45 to 5:00 P.M. (Woodward, Mass.)

Roumania. Sometimes we wonder if there is such a station as YRO, Baneasa, reported on 12.16 mc. between noon and 1:00 P.M. and around 15.40 mc. around 9:00 to 10:15 P.M. A good many members say this is a Russian station. Member Fister says it is RV99 at Irkutak on 15.41 mc. and member Callan heard the announcer at Moscow say RV99 was broadcasting on 15.41 mc.

Holland. PCJ on 9.56 mc., PCJ-2 on 15.22 mc. and PHI-2 on 17.77 mc. all operate on an irregular schedule, changing about once each week. You may hear any of them not on the schedule we show.

Ireland. A new schedule is in effect. Radio Eirann, Dublin, is on 17.84 mc., 7:30 to 8:30 A.M. and 9:00 to 10:00 A.M., on 9.595 mc. 12:30 to 4:30 P.M. and 5:00 to 6:00 P.M. Power 15,000 watts now, (Lowery, England). Heard at 5:00 P.M. now, (Bird, Del.)

Switzerland. The Swiss stations are oftentimes rented to relay programs and since the war have kept a very irregular schedule. We list only the regular scheduled programs.

Germany. DXB, Berlin, on 9.61 mc. starts up at noon, not 2:00 P.M. as shown in list, (Bird, Del.) DJA on 9.56 mc. is heard from noon to 3:00 P.M., not shown in schedule, (Bird). DJC on 6.02 mc. heard at 8:00 P.M., off schedule, (Woodward, Mass.)

England. Mail from England is very slow now and we only received the program sheet for December 25th as we go to press. It does not show station GSA on 6.05 mc., GSW on 7.23 mc. and GRX on 9.69 mc., all of which were heard last month. Our list is a combination of what members report to us and what we receive in the bulletins published by the B.B.C. GSO, 15.17 mc., heard at 8:45 A.M. (Woodward, Mass.)

Denmark. OZF, Skamlebaek, on 9.52 mc. sends veri saying 8:00 to 8:30 P.M. for South American fans and 9:30 to 11:00 P.M. for North American fans, (Robinson, Iowa).

Russia. An official program tells us the following stations are broadcasting programs:

7.36 mc.—4:00 to 5:00 P. M. Sundays.

7.52 mc—3:00 to 6:15 P. M. daily (English at 4:30).

8.06 mc.—3:00 to 3:30 P. M. daily.

11.63 mc.—At 3:00 A.M. and 6:00 A. M. daily.

11.90 Mc.-4:00 to 5:00 P. M. daily.

14.72 mc.—5:30 to 6:30 A. M. daily.

15.58 mc.—At 7:00 A. M. daily.

Member Boothroyd says the station on 7.36 mc. is RWG, Moscow, and it was heard at noon. Members Callan and Stockbridge report a station on 11.65 mc. at 6:00 A.M.

France. A new Parisian station is on 11.843 mc. from 12:30 to 1:30 P. M. and again later in the afternoon when it joins TPB12 on 11.88 mc. And one on 9.68 mc. is heard at 6:00 P.M. (Callan, Mass.) TPB12 on 11.88 is used 1:00 to 4:00 A.M. daily; TPB11 on 7.28 mc. is used 1:00 to 4:00 daily; TPB3 on 17.85 mc. is used 5:00 to 10:00 P.M. daily, and the new address of all French broadcast stations is 103 Rue de Grenelle, Paris, (Boothroyd, England).

Spain. Radio Malaga, on 7.22 mc. heard between 3:30 and 6:00 P.M. often, (Bird, Delaware). EAJ9, Malaga, on 7.22 mc. till 6:00 P.M. (Legge, N. Y.) EAQ, Madrid, on 9.86 mc. signed off at 3:24 P.M. according to member Zimpleman, which makes the schedule sent us last month by one member wrong.

SOUTH AMERICA

Argentina. LRA5, Buenos Aires, on 17.83 mc. heard from 3:00 to 5:00 P.M. Fridays, (Anthony, D. C.) LRA2, 6.185 mc. is on the air some evenings 5:30 to 9:00 P.M. LRX, Buenos Aires, on 9.66 mc. heard signing off at 10:10 P.M., not 1:00 A.M. (Dement, Pa.) Note—LRX may leave the air at any hour of the day, or remain on.

Bolivia. CP-5 La Paz, heard on 6.20 mc. weakly, around 9:00 to 11:00 P.M. often, (Legge, N. Y.)

Brazil. Telephone station PSA, Rio de Janeiro, on 21.08 mc. heard broadcasting in Italian, 11:00 A.M. to noon, (Boothroyd, England). PSK, Rio de Janeiro, on 8.20 mc. is relaying the programs of PSH around 6:00 to 7:00 P.M. (Callan, Mass.) PSE, same city, on 14.94 mc. also is heard around 7:00 to 8:00 P.M. at times. PRA-8, Pernambuco, on 6.02 mc. heard signing off at 9:00, not 8:00 P.M. as listed, (Bird, Del.)

Chile. CB-1174, Santiago, "Radio Houcke" relays CB-93 from 6:00 to 10:30 P.M. and is reported about once a year. CB-960, Santiago, on 9.60 heard till 10:00 P.M. instead of just 8:30 P.M. (Dement, Pa.)

Colmobia. HJ6ABA, at Pereira, heard on 6.05 mc. till 9:45 P.M. (Lundberg, Minn.) Uses call HJFA, slogan "La Voz de Pereira" (Legge, N. Y.) HJDU, old HJ4ADU, Medellin, finally moved from 8.65 mc. to 4.805 mc. last month, (Oxrieder, C. Z.) HJ4DAE, Medellin, on 6.14 mc. is using the call HJDE now, (Legge, N. Y.) HJ4DAX, Medellin, (we have no record of this one) is heard on 4.785 mc. evenings, (Legge, N. Y.) HJFK, La Voz de Amiga," at Pereira, is now on 4.864 mc. nights and 9.73 mc. days, starting up around 7:00 A.M. They verified, giving power at 2,500 watts, (Legge, N. Y.) Note—The veri did not say 9.73 mc., and since Colombian stations are NOT supposed to be near 9.73, we still wonder if this is a harmonic,

the same as HJCF, Bogota, is heard on 9.70 as well as 4.87 mc.

Venezuela. YV5RW, Caracas, heard on 3.40 mc. 8:00 to 9:30 P.M. and YV5RV, La Guara, heard on 3.50 mc. 7:00 to 9:00 P.M. (Legge, N. Y.) YV5RH, Caracas, on 4.95 mc. and YV5RU, on 4.82 mc. have disappeared, (Oxrieder, C. Z.) Note—YV5RH is on 4.83 mc.—Editor. YV5RY, Caracas is on 4.76, not 4.79 mc. (Oxrieder). YV5RO, Caracas, is on 4.94 mc. and YV4RO, Valencia, is on 4.95 (Gallagher, Calif.) YV5RO is heard on 5.94 mc. at Caracas. YV4RP, Valencia, on 4.93 mc. signs off at 10:00, not 10:30 PM. YV1RJ, Coro, on 4.97 mc. signs off at 10:00 P.M. and YV3RX, Baraquisimeto, on 4.99 mc. signs off at 9:30 P.M., not 10:00 P.M. (Lundburg, Minn. Quite a mixed-up affair.

Peru. OAX1A, Chiclayo, moved from 6.18 to 6.335 mc. (Legge, N. Y.)

CENTRAL AMERICA

Mexico. XEQQ, Mexico City, was heard on 9.68 mc. from 7:00 P.M. to midnight in spite of Paris being on this wave, and they verified, writing 968, without putting in the period, giving address as Radio Panamericana S. 

SHORT WAVE NEWS

What many people call "skill" in tuning for short wave stations is nothing more or less than knowing WHEN and WHERE to tune for stations. Nearly all short wave stations are experimental and change their wave lengths or schedules almost without notice. To know when these changes take place is as important to successful reception as having a good receiver.

The time is given in Eastern Standard. Add five hours for Greenwich

Mean Time.

Stations Under Construction

Little America. Admiral Byrd's Expedition will have three commercial and three amateur calls. Amateur calls will be KC4USA at the West Base, KC4USB at the East Base, and KC4USC on the snow cruiser. Commercial calls will be KTRK West Base, KTRC East Base and KTRA on the snow cruiser. (Graulick, N. J.) The expedition will have sixteen com-

mercial frequencies and will operate on the 20, 40 and 80 meter bands as an amateur station contacting amateur stations the world over. (Editor), KTRC, KTRK and KTRA will use the following frequencies when working each other. 6.42 mc., 9.13 mc., 11.06 mc., 12.84 mc., 23.00 mc. and 30.66 mc.

Cuba. A station COCN, Havana, is supposed to open on 9.437 mc. soon. Greece. Two new transmitters of high power will operate from Sparta as follows: 6.885—SVD; 7.228—SVL; 7.805—SVG; 9.03—SVH; 9.695—SVI; 9.825—SVJ; 9.935—SVM; 10.705—SVN; 12.195—SVP; 13.64—SVQ.

Belgium. A new transmitter at Ruysselede, the home of ORK, will soon operate on 11.85 mc. and will have 45,000 watts power.

Cincinnati, Ohio. The new WLWO, 50,000 watt transmitter is nearing completion and will be heard soon. With beam antennas this new station may operate as follows: 606 mc, 959 mc., 15.27 mc and 21.56 mc.

New Zealand. We have two different reports on stations under construction at Wellington. From New Zealand came word that around January first a new station will go on the air. Wavelengths are ZL-1 on 9.54 mc., ZL-2 on 11.78 mc., ZL-3 on 15.28 and ZL-4 on 17.77. Member Fister says it is ZL-1 on 6.08 mc., ZL-2 on 9.54 mc., etc.

Senagal. Rumors prevail that shortly a new 10 kw. short wave broadcast station will commence operations at Dakar. It will be under the supervision of the Minister des Postes et Telegraphos.

Chile. CB-946, Santiago, a new 5 kw. station to operate on 9.46 mc. is under construction.

Iran. Iron will have two transmitters on the air very soon. EQB on 6.55 mc. with 2,000 watts power, and EQC on 9.68 mc. with 20,000 watts power. (Boothroyd, England). We have word that the transmitters were shipped early in January. (Editor).

Spain. The new government has ordained that a new 40 kw. transmitter, to operate on several frequencies be built.

Venezuela. A transmitter to be operated by the Director of Radio Communications at Caracas will operate on 6.172 mc. (YVKF) 9.64 mc.





SHORT WAVE NEWS

What many people call "skill" in tuning for short wave stations is nothing more or less than knowing WHEN and WHERE to tune for stations. Nearly all short wave stations are experimental and change their wave lengths or schedules almost without notice. To know when these changes take place is as important to successful reception as having a good receiver.

The time is given in Eastern Standard. Add five hours for Greenwich Mean Time.

To know when these changes take place is as important to successful reception as having a good receiver.



What many people call "skill" in tuning for short wave stations is nothing more or less than knowing WHEN and WHERE to tune for stations. Nearly all short wave stations are experimental and change their wave lengths or schedules almost without notice. To know when these changes take place is as important to successful reception as having a good receiver.

The time is given in Eastern Standard. Add five hours for Greenwich Mean Time.



What many people call "skill" in tuning for short wave stations is nothing more or less than knowing WHEN and WHERE to tune for stations. Nearly all short wave stations are experimental and change their wave lengths or schedules almost without notice. To know when these changes take place is as important to successful reception as having a good receiver.

The time is given in Eastern Standard. Add five hours for Greenwich Mean Time.

Mozambique. The latest letter announces a change. CR7AA is now on 6.03 mc. with 300 watts power. CR7AB on 3.49 mc., CR7BH on 11.71 mc. and CR7BD on 15.25 mc. are still used. The schedule is still midnight to 1:00 A.M., 5:30 to 6:30 A.M. and noon to 4:00 P.M. week-days and 5:00 to 7:00 A.M. and 10:00 A.M. to 2:00 P.M. Sundays. CR7BE with 10 kw. power is on the air week-days 2:00 to 4:00 P.M. on 9.71 mc., 30.88 meters, (Stockbridge, Mass.) CR7BD on 15.25 mc. is heard midnight to 1:00 A.M. week-days, (Gallagher, Calif.)

XGOY on 11.90 mc. is heard around noon by member Gallagher, so evidently it was not blown up as reported. They closed for repairs, it is said.

What many people call "skill" in tuning for short wave stations is nothing more or less than knowing WHEN and WHERE to tune for stations. Nearly all short wave stations are experimental and change their wave lengths or schedules almost without notice. To know when these changes take place is as important to successful reception as having a good receiver.

The time is given in Eastern Standard. Add five hours for Greenwich Mean Time.

What many people call "skill" in tuning for short wave stations is nothing more or less than knowing WHEN and WHERE to tune for stations. To know when these changes take place is as important to successful reception as having a good receiver.
