What many people call "skill" in tuning for short wave stations is nothing more or less than knowing WHEN and WHERE to tune for stations. Nearly all short wave stations are experimental and change their wave lengths or schedules almost without notice. To know when these changes take place is as important to successful reception as having a good receiver.

The time is given in Eastern Standard. Add five hours for Greenwich

Mean Time.

Does not mention station on 6.03 mc. at 3:00 A.M., 6.12 mc. 5:00 to 7:30 A.M., 9.19 mc., 9:30 to 10:30 A.M., or 15.23 mc., 4:00 to 4:50 P.M., all heard in Australia, (Gallagher, Calif.). Heard on 6.12 mc. 1:30 to 3:00 A.M. (Teague, Calif.)





When our own great nation, The United States of America, entered the war, it meant that radio factories had to jump to the aid of our fighting forces and turn out army and navy material. It also meant that many of our members had to give up their listening posts to take up arms for our country. As a result, we find that we are not able to carry on our work on the basis as when the world was at peace, or even as before the United States entered the war.

Therefore, friends, it becomes necessary for me to say that hereafter this paper will be published only irregularly. RELAYING MESSAGES FROM PRISONERS

In reply to a communication to the war department relative to relaying messages from prisoners of war in Japan, which are broadcast nightly over JZK on 15.16 mc. now, we have received a letter stating that there has been set up in Washington a Bureau charged with the duty of disseminating all such information. Lt. Col. B. M. Bryan, F. A., tells us that it would be a great help to the War Department if our organization would assume the duty of taking down such messages and forwarding them to the Office of Provost Marshal General.

We have half a dozen volunteers, many of whom have been sending messages direct to relatives of these prisoners. We are trying to work out a plan whereby there will be little duplication of messages and little chance that any messages will be missed. We believe that we should get as many volunteers as possible, have them each supplied with forms giving the name and classification of the prisoner, what part of the address of the relative that can be supplied, the message itself and the name and address of the listener. Messages will be sent to the War Department where complete addresses can be supplied and the messages mailed. We are open to suggestions on this subject. At the same time we want to hear from more volunteers. We just can not get too many. Later on we hope to enlarge the service to take care of messages from our armed forces in Australia and Ireland from where messages will soon be broadcast.



What many people call "skill" in tuning for short wave stations is nothing more or less than knowing WHEN and WHERE to tune for stations. Nearly all short wave stations are experimental and change their wave lengths or schedules almost without notice. To know when these changes take place is as important to successful reception as having a good receiver.
